GUIDELINES

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Number of Works: Four (4) maximum per school

Age Groups: Grades 4-6: Two (2) entries maximum
Grades 7-8: Two (2) entries maximum

Time Limit for Presentations: 3–5 minutes **MAXIMUM**

Presentation Time: 4-6 Slideshow Presentations (10:00am to 11:30am)
7-8 Slideshow Presentations (11:30am-1:00 pm)

Requested: Please **submit a hard copy of the presentation** at registration on the day of the Fair.

Restrictions/Limitations:

- MAESA asks that students share their best informative, research-based presentations. A student or group can present information on a subject of their choice.
- The visual output to guide the presentation can be a PowerPoint, Glogster, Pixie/Wixie, Animoto, Prezi, Google's Presentation, or another vehicle to help guide the student through their topic.
- The presentation needs to have been created within the past two years.

Technical Requirements:

- Each presenter will need to bring his or her own laptop (Mac or PC) from which they will present.
- Your presentation may be web-based.
- There will be an open WiFi network available for all participants.

- VGA/3.5mm Audio and Type A HDMI connections are available to connect your own Mac or PC to a projector
- Please bring the necessary adapters for computers using mini HDMI, DisplayPort, DVI etc.

<p>CONTENT</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Introduction presents the overall subject and captures the attention of the audience. -The topic is covered in-depth with details, accuracy, and examples. -If video clips are thoughtfully chosen to enhance the presentation, they run no more than 2 minutes total. -Subject knowledge is demonstrated. 				
<p>COMMUNICATION</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Student demonstrates original thought, preparation, and knowledge of content. -Student captures and holds the audience's attention. -Student maintains eye contact. -Student speaks distinctly and modulates voice for emphasis. 				
<p>ORGANIZATION & DESIGN</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Overall content and slide content is well organized and proves a logical progression of ideas and support information. -Tools are used effectively to enhance the subject and readability. Tools do not distract from the content. 				
<p>MECHANICS & TIMING</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Accuracy in writing mechanics is evident throughout the presentation including in: grammar, spelling, punctuation, capitalization. -Presentation is 3-6 minutes
