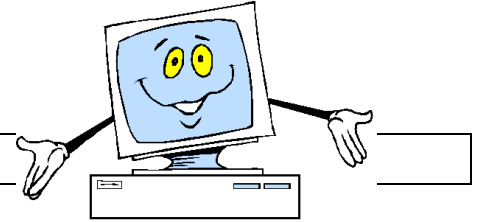

- Number of Works:** Four (4) maximum entries per school from your school
- Age Groups:** Grades 4-6: Two (2) entries in Multimedia Informative Presentation
Grades 7-8: Two (2) entries in Multimedia Informative Presentation
- Time Limit for Presentations:** 4 minutes **MAXIMUM**
- Project Timeslots:** 4-6 Project Judging (9:30-11:00 a.m.)
7-8 Project Judging (9:30-11:00 a.m.)
- Tech Drop-off:** **Participants should drop off devices in competition room upon arrival but no later than 9:15 a.m.**

Restrictions/Limitations:

- Students should share their best, informative, research-based presentations. A student or a group of students may present on a subject of their choice.
- The presentation may be a PowerPoint, iMove, Prezi, Google Slides or another format
- In order to be eligible, projects must have been produced during the past two school years.

Technical Advice:

- Each entrant will need to bring his/her own device from which they will display their project.
- Projects may be web-based, however it is recommended that students download a copy as a backup on their device. Using a CD or DVD is not recommended.
- There will be an open WiFi network available for all participants.

Hardware/Software Available Upon Request:

- VGA and HDMI connections are available as well as connections via Apple TV. All adapters must be provided by the presenter
- A limited number of laptops with Office 2016 installed will be available for backup use.
