- Number of Works:** Four (4) maximum entries per school from your school
- Age Groups:** Grades 4-6: Two (2) entries in Multimedia Informative Presentation  
Grades 7-8: Two (2) entries in Multimedia Informative Presentation
- Time Limit for Presentations:** 4 minutes **MAXIMUM**
- Project Timeslots:** 4-6 Project Judging (9:30-11:00 a.m.)  
7-8 Project Judging (9:30-11:00 a.m.)
- Sharing Guidelines:** **Entrants are strongly encouraged to share their projects ahead of time via Google Drive or other web-accessible link. A Google Form will be provided to each school, which will then enter the participant's name, the appropriate category, and the link to the project. All projects can then be presented using a Chromebook that St. Patrick's will provide.**
- For projects that cannot be shared ahead of time in this way, please provide contact information so the coordinator can work with you on presenting the project in another way.**
- Tech Drop-off:** Only if necessary, participants should drop off devices in competition room upon arrival but no later than 9:15 a.m.
- Restrictions/Limitations:**
- Students should share their best, informative, research-based presentations. A student or a group of students may present on a subject of their choice.
  - The presentation may be a PowerPoint, iMovie, Prezi, Google Slides or another format
  - In order to be eligible, projects must have been produced during the past two school years.
  - Before submitting, all projects must be reviewed using an equity, diversity, and inclusion lens. Please ask an adult at your school to review the project and provide feedback using this lens.
- Judging Criteria:** See attached Rubric for criteria: Intro, Communication, Tools, Digital Methods & Timing
- Judges :** PLEASE encourage your faculty/chaperones to be a judge for this creative category! **This year we need 4 judges (2 per room) since both multimedia age groups are running simultaneously.**

<p><b>CONTENT</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Introduction presents the overall subject and captures the attention of the audience.</li> <li>- The topic is covered in depth with detail, accuracy and examples.</li> <li>- If video clips are chosen to enhance the presentation, they comprise no more than 2min of the total 4-minute presentation.</li> <li>- Subject knowledge is demonstrated.</li> </ul>				
<p><b>COMMUNICATION</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Student demonstrates original thought, preparation and knowledge of content.</li> <li>- Student maintains eye contact.</li> <li>- Student speaks distinctly and modulates voice for emphasis.</li> <li>-Project captures and holds the audience’s attention.</li> </ul>				
<p><b>ORGANIZATION &amp; DESIGN</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Tools are used effectively to enhance the subject and readability. Tools do not distract from content.</li> <li>- Overall content and slide materials is well organized and provides a logical progression of both ideas and supportive information.</li> </ul>				
<p><b>MECHANICS &amp; TIMING</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Neatly presented; Spelling, grammar, punctuation, capitalization are consistent.</li> <li>-Presentation is <b>4 minutes</b> including introduction, presenting materials and wrap-up.</li> </ul>
